

What do I say in my Will if I want to leave a gift to Bletchley Park?

If you are kindly considering leaving us a legacy then the wording below can be used in your Will. However, we always recommend that you take professional advice to ensure the legacy meets your personal circumstances. If you already have a Will you can add a codicil. All you have to do is add a sum of money or a percentage of your estate (it could be just 1% to ensure individuals you care about are protected).

Residuary gift

I give a% share of the residue of my estate to Bletchley Park Trust, The Mansion, Sherwood Drive, Bletchley, Milton Keynes MK3 6EB Registered charity 1012743 to be used for its general charitable purposes and I declare that the receipt of their Treasurer or other proper officer shall be a full and sufficient discharge.

Cash gift

I give free of tax to Bletchley Park Trust, The Mansion, Sherwood Drive, Bletchley, Milton Keynes MK3 6EB

For instance, if you would like another beneficiary to benefit from your inheritance first (such as your spouse) and then for Bletchley Park to benefit after the death of your spouse ask your adviser about a "reversionary gift".
