Background

Bletchley Park is a place of exceptional historical importance, open to visitors throughout the year. It remains highly relevant

to our lives today and for the future. It is the home of British code breaking and a birthplace of modern information technology. It played a major role in World War Two, producing secret intelligence which had a direct and profound influence

on the outcome of the conflict

Purpose of Role

- To assist the gardeners with their daily duties with the care, maintenance and development of the Trusts Historic Landscape and habitats.
- To report to the Lead Gardener and assist with any jobs under his leadership or working with other members of the team
- To help ensure that every visitor to Bletchley Park enjoys an excellent visitor experience by providing excellent service at all times.
- To be an ambassador of the Bletchley Park Trust, upholding the Trust's aim and mission statement.

Key tasks

Gardening:

- Maintain and enhance historical landscape features,
- Helping out with the general upkeep of the garden:
 - o tidying up
 - dead-heading
 - weeding borders
 - o pruning shrubs and plants
 - grass cutting
 - o looking after garden machinery and equipment
- Helping out with the planned development of the garden,
- Installing and repairing fences, benches, gates, and other estate furniture.
- Path creation, clearance, and maintenance

Maintenance:

- Assist the Visitor Services Team with preparing, setting up and running events e.g., concerts, 1940s weekends,
 - Putting out chairs (we have deck chairs on the lawn in the summer)
 - o Moving tables, chairs, setting up gazebos
- Assisting the Caretakers in keeping the estate tidy and presentable (including litter picking and routine checks)
- Painting walls, fences or other surfaces damaged by winter weather
- There may be other activities where we could use your help.

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Ensuring Health and Safety compliance:

To ensure that Health and Safety policy is adhered to for the safety of our visitors.

To ensure emergency evacuation procedures are followed correctly

This list is not an exhaustive list of tasks you may be asked to carry out but is intended to give a flavour of what the role might entail.
